SMART[™] Lesson Predicting Outcomes

When we read fiction, we are often interested in what happens to the characters in the story. Sometimes, we can predict what will happen before we get to the end of the book. Being able to predict what will happen next can be helpful in understanding the story and making connections with the characters.

How to Predict Outcomes

There are several strategies we can use to predict what will happen next in a story:

- 1. **Look for clues** The author often leaves clues throughout the story that can help the reader predict what will happen next. These clues can come in the form of foreshadowing, hints about characters' personalities, or details about the setting or time period of the story.
- 2. **Use prior knowledge** Sometimes, our own experiences and knowledge can help us predict what will happen next in a story. For example, if we know that most superhero stories involve a battle between good and evil, we might predict that the hero will face a difficult challenge later in the story.
- 3. **Make inferences** Making inferences means using the information we already have to draw conclusions about what might happen next. For example, if a character in a story is described as being very sick, we might infer that they will need medical attention later on in the story.

Rachel had always loved going to the beach. She loved the feeling of the sand between her toes and the salty smell of the ocean air. Suddenly, she heard a loud noise and turned to see a group of teenagers running towards her.
